Developmental psychology oral exam topics and keywords

- 1. The aim of Developmental Psychology, Genetic and biological determinants of development (principles of lifespan perspective, Sources of development: genetic inheritance vs. environment, genotype, phenotype, mutations, hereditary disorders, Tetratogens; The question of continuity; Individual differences)
- 2. Attachment (attachment behavior, attachment theories Freud, Erikson, Harlow, Mary Ainsworth), attachment development, attachment styles, social deprivation, multiple attachment; Infant emotions
- 3. Peer relationships (relationship types, measurement options, characteristics of sociometric status, sociometric figures, dyadic relationships, functions of friendship, lack of friendship)

- 6. Psychosexual development (gender identity development, gender roles, family and gender development, puberty- physical and hormonal changes, the start of puberty, Consequences of early and late maturation)
- 7. Development of self-awareness and self-image (what is self?, the separation of the self, signs of of self-development is speech, self-awareness, self-image, body schema, self-recognition, self-image in preschool and school age, social comparison)
- 8. Development of emotions (primary and secondary emotions, The two-step theory of emotional development, Self-control- Maccoby, aggression- hostile and instrumental, sex differences, aggression between siblings and among peers, Theories of aggression; prosocial behavior-explanations, empathy theory, developing a helpful attitude)
- 9. Developmental psychology aspects of drawing (drawing as a means of expression, externalization, theoretical approaches to drawing development, stages of drawing development, Drawing tests (Man in the Rain, Draw a Person, Family Drawing)
- 10. The psychological role and significance of fairy tales in development, storytelling (the joy of recognition, story-books, double consciousness, characteristics of a good tale, dynamics of desire fulfilment, end of the tale period)
